On the 23rd of December, I received a call from Ella's case manager requesting urgent support for a client who was facing risk of Anti-Trafficking mission deportation back to Nigeria. Therefore, on Christmas Eve - December 24th, myself and her caseworker wrote and submitted an appeal on behalf of Ruby\* and her family, establishing grounds for her right to remain in the UK.

This was our first referral, and since then, we have spent the past 12 months advancing support services to women similar to Ruby, ensuring their legal protection and access to development opportunities.

#### **OUR MISSION**

The mission of ROMILDAMOR is to support women and girls who have been victimized by socially unjust practices such as: Human Trafficking, Gender Based Violence & Child Marriage.

In order to fulfill this, we operate through three mainstreams:

- 1. Capacity Building;
- 2. Community Awareness; and
- 3. Fashion Funding

#### **CAPACITY BUILDING**

We work to enable survivors to have access to career development, academic development, legal support and therapy support opportunities.

#### **COMMUNITY AWARENESS**

Through our regular events, we educate and enlighten communities about these socially unjust practices, we hold annual screenings, panel discussions and webinars.

#### **FASHION FUNDING**

The Maison ROMILDAMOR is our fashion hub where we design and sell womenswear pieces to raise funds for the survivors we work with and to also enable consumers to support the stand against human trafficking by wearing our garments.

The overall purpose of our organisation is to advance the Anti- Trafficking & GBV mission by supporting survivors and spreading awareness



#### **OUR MISSION**

The issue of Human Trafficking does not end when a victim has been rescued. From that point, a whole new issue arises and that is the future of the victim and how to break the cycle of dependency they have on their traffickers.

Providing development opportunities to survivors of injustice is paramount in ensuring their protection, wellbeing and re-integration back into society.

Through our Capacity Building programme, we are able to invest in each woman and enable them to achieve their life goals - through training, employment opportunities, therapy surpport and legal support.

We endeavour to break cycles of poverty, violence and disadvantage once and for all by reducing marginalisation and increasing opportunities for social inclusion.

A survivor of Human

Our NGO Partners are organisations that work directly to rescue and house victims of Human Trafficking & Gender Based Violence.

We receive referrals from these partners to provide survivors with post-trafficking support. 2

- LEGAL SUPPORT
- THERAPY SUPPORT
- ACADEMIC DEVELOPMENT
- CAREER DEVELOPMENT

The ROMILDAMOR Team will work with the client on an independent basis to facilitate support to them in their desired areas.

We have a team of in house therapists to provide regular counselling sessions to each client and support their well being journey.

Our interpreters assist us in ensuring we communicate effectively with each client and can understand provide all their requests.

#### THE 4 PILLARS - Capacity Building

#### Legal Support

Survivors of Human Trafficking and GBV have very limited access to legal advice and support. It is therefore a priority for ROMILDAMOR to ensure that the survivors who join the Capacity Building Programme are given the opportunity to access Pro Bono Legal Advice services.

These services operate through our partnerships with Pro Bono Organisations and specialist Lawyers who provide survivors with representation on cases in Immigration, Civil, Housing, Family and Employment law.

#### Therapy Support

The mental health and wellbeing of survivors is so crucial.

Depression, anxiety, PTSD, selfharm and attempted suicide are common mental health issues that victims face.

This is why ROMILDAMOR deems it highly essential to put together therapy and counselling support.

We will be working with experts who will continually provide therapy sessions to all survivors on our Capacity Building Programme.

#### Career Development

ROMILDAMOR works with Corporate organisations, Financial services, Professional services Firms and Small Businesses to build a partnership programme that can create rewarding career opportunities for survivors.

Provision of employment and volunteer opportunities will enable survivors to build a career and secure a legitimate income.

This helps to break the cycle of financial instability, enabling our clients to reintegrate back into society.

#### **Academic Development**


ROMILDAMOR works in partnership with CityLit and Headstart Tutoring to provide free ESOL courses to our clients and English language practice sessions also.

Our clients also have the opportunity to enroll unto additional courses of their interest. We encourage this in conjunction with our Career Development opportunities as they both work so well hand in hand.

Knowledge is power and it provides a gateway of establishment and advancement for these women & girls.

#### HIGHLIGHTS Legal Support

#### WINNING HOUSING CASE!

The ROMILDAMOR Legal team successfully challenged the local city council in a legal housing dispute on behalf of our client - a survivor of domestic servitude.

The council initially refused to provide housing based on the fact that our client was a university student and was receiving access to public recourse. This created a difficult stance for our client as she had no alternative means of accomodation.

She was diagnosed as disabled due to blindness in one eye, has a diagnosis of psychosis, and is a vulnerable person after fleeing trafficking, sexual exploitation and domestic abuse.

The council completely disregarded these factors and their denial of support was a method used to avoid responsibility.

With the support of the Hackney Law Clinic, the council eventually accepted the duty of care owed to our client and worked to find suitable housing for our client, in a safe and well-adjusted area.

We are very pleased that this matter has been settled and in the words of our client's caseworker:

"She is absolutely loving her new place, thank you ROMILDAMOR!"



#### HIGHLIGHTS Therapy Support

#### **WE HIRED OUR FIRST IN - HOUSE THERAPIST!**

When we set up the Therapy Support department, our aim was to ensure that clients have 'regular' (and where required; long term) access to therapy counselling.

A majority of the women who were referred to ROMILDAMOR in 2021, have received some form of free counselling - however it was usually only 5 sessions which didn't give them the opportunity to connect with their therapist.

Our team decided to look into ways we could counter this and provide the option for our clients to receive long term therapy counselling. Through the incredible financial support of our sponsor; The Pure Good Foundation and the diligent work of our Therapy Support Ambassador; Arjin Aktas - we were able to source and recruit our first in - house therapist.

<u>Dr. Jennie Geddes</u> is an experienced psycologist with over 20 years experience working with survivors of exploitation and specifically within the non profit sector.

Dr. Geddes has made a great impact in the work of ROMILDAMOR and we really look forward to the additional support she will be providing to all our clients; present and future.



#### HIGHLIGHTS Career Development

#### **JOB SECURED FOR SURVIVOR!**

Our client Wendy\* was exploited through labour trafficking here in the United Kingdom. She eventually managed to find support and shelter through our NGO Partner; ELLA's.

Last year, Wendy was referred to ROMILDAMOR for Career Development opportunities. She was specifically seeking a support in finding a job in a restaurant, catering facility.

Our Career Development Ambassador; Megan Sutcliffe put together a concise plan for Wendy and we got to work to find her the best job opportunities.

Due to the fact that Wendy had previously experienced Forced Labour exploitation, it was very important that the opportunity we sourced was with an employer that carried lues that aligned with that of ROMILDAMOR. We wanted to ensure that Wendy was in noway at risk of any harm and rather would work in an environment where she was protected, safe and blossoming.

Romilda (founder) reached out to the Luminary Bakery, an incredible charity bakery that specifically works to provide opportunities for women who have been exploited and faced GBV.

The team at Luminary have been incredibly supportive and we have been able to provide Wendy with a job at the bakery.

Starting mid-January 2022, Wendy will be working as a part-time kitchen staff. She is beyond thrilled about this opportunity.

#### **PARTNERSHIP WITH CITY LIT!**


A majority of the women who are referred to ROMILDAMOR, have been trafficked from outside the UK and as a result of this, usually English is not their first language.

As part of their development journey, a lot women have aspirations to work on their English language skills.

In order to provide these opportunities, we partnered with City Lit college and their Head of Development - Ian Wollington officiated the provision of free ESOL courses to all client's on our Capacity Building Programme.

We currently have 7 clients enrolled in ESOL classes and have been thoroughly enjoying this new learning experience.

This is very exciting, as it is a great step in the right direction to enable our clients to achieve their career development goals and integrate into society in a comfortable and confident manner.

# Anti - Trafficking in the United Kingdom

On the 8th of March 2021, we held our annual International Women's Day screening event (via Zoom) with Dame Sara Thornton (UK's Anti-Slavery Commissioner), Marcia Langdon (Partner, Kingsley Napely) and Minke van Til (Co-Director of ELLA's).

The theme of the evening was Anti-Trafficking in the UK, focusing on the impact that Brexit and COVID-19 have had on the mission to eradicate modern slavery day.

It was particularly interesting to hear from Dame Sara Thornton and her role in enforcing this mission as a representative of the UK Government.

Additionally, the contributions of Marcia Longdon as co-chair of the ABA's Human Trafficking Association and Minke van Til (Ella's) were incredibly insighful.



# Anti - Slavery Summer Event Forced Labour Trafficking in Supply Chains

Our summer events are always a great opportunity to gather and screen an insightful documentary and have enlightening conversations about development issues with our audiences.

Due to the pandemic, we were limited to holding our events virtually, so this event on the 12th of August 2021 was special as it was our first in person event since the COVID - 19 outbreak.

It is safe to say, we are more than moved by her words and grateful to have been able to provide support and representation for her.
